Dear Mr and Mrs Day:

Last Sunday, my husband and I were in the Haverhill, N.H. Cemetery looking for the grave-site of Hannah B. Gould, b. Dec. 15, 1825 at Little Birbeck, Cape Breton, Canada... who came to Haverhill, N.H. when she was six-years old (according to her own deposition) (therefore in 1831) "with her family".... her father being William Gould, born 1780 at Little Birbeck, Cape Breton, Canada... and her mother Sophia..... (I don't know her maiden name, or her birthdate or place of birth) Her mother Sophia "Wife of William Gould", died May 19, 1865, at the age of 75 years.. according to her gravestone in the Pine Hill Village Cemetery.... where there is a small stone for William Gould (probably her husband----but there are no dates of either birth or death on the stone... and also a small stone for Ellen Gould (1827-1882) their daughter---and a sister to Hannah B. Gould Day....

In October 15, 1919, my husband's uncle, Leonard R. Hardwick (a veterinarian) stopped at Mrs. Day's home... and stayed overnight there.. and at that time he took a snap-shot of Mrs. Hannah H. Gould Day, which we now have and treasure. We do not know when Mrs. Day died... or where she may be buried... and how her looking... to no avail... and when we found the stones in the Haverhill, N.H. Cemetery----we thought we would write to you to see whether or not you can help us with the information we lack to complete our "Gould" genealogy... You see James Gould, Jr. was born Dec. 18, 1765 in Hollis, N.H. the son of Lt. James Gould and Mary (Lovejoy) and was "waiter" to his wounded father in 1777 to the date of his discharge in September 19, 1777.. after which time he was married to..... (do not know the name of his wife?) and they removed to Sydney, Cape Breton, Canada... where at least three children were born to them:
1. Susan Gould, b. at Little Birbeck, Cape Breton, Canada; (nothing more known)
2. William Gould, b. to Sophia..... She died May 19, 1865, aged 75 years (grave stone at Pike, Hill Cem.) William Gould is buried there, also,
but there are no dates on his stone. Their cat
