Henry the 3^d Kinge of England mar. Eliouer Da. & Coheire to Raymon E. of Province. *Gules three lions passant guardant in pale or, impaling or four pallets gules.*

William Cole of Hutenesleigh in the County of Devon liued A^o 1243. Rot. Inquis. 27 H. 3. *Argent a bull passant sable armed etc. or, a bordure of the second bezanté.*

Michaell Archdeacon of the County of Devon. Carta 27 H. 3. *Argent three chevrons sable.*

S^r Stephen de Haccomb liued in the tyme of K. H. 3. *Argent three bendlets sable.*

John Leuker married Mabel Da. of Roger Russell of Pensenton. *Argent a bend raguly azure between six escallops gules, impaling argent on a bend sable three swans proper.*

William Lord Warren died before his father.

Jane daughter of Robert Vere Earle of Oxford. Warren, *impaling quarterly gules and or, a mullet in first quarter argent.*

S^r Otto Bodrugan Knight died 6 E. 3. Esc. 2 E. 2. N^o 71.

Margaret daughter of S^r William Champernon Knight. *Argent three bendlets gules, impaling gules a saltire vair between twelve billets or.*

This note is of ye 2^d Sr Oto belowe. Esc. 6 Ed. 3. Oto Bodrugan died seized in fee of the Mannors of Rostranget Tremodret and Tregerau &c. in ye County of Cornwall, Q^d Henry Bodrugan his sonn and heire.

King Edward the first Kinge of England.

Eliouer Daughter of Ferdynando & sister of Alfonsus Kings of Castile.

Gules three lions passant guardant in pale or, impaling Castile and Leon quarterly.

This Deed of King William the Conquerors was written in the Saxon tongue 5^o W. C. A^o 1070 and was put into English A^o 1557, 15^o May A^o 27^o RR. Elizabetha. And remaynes in the Bishop of Winchester's custody. William King greetes Walkeselein Bishop and Huga de Port, and Edward Knighte, Steward and Algesime, and Symon and Allfus Porveleur, and Cole, & Arderne and all the Barons in Hamshiere, and Wiltshire freindly, And know ye that I giue vnto St Peter and Walchelyne Bishop with all the Covent to be as free as Bishop Alsyme was in the Dayes of King Edw. and to hold and enjoy all the priuiledges great and small. And I giue commaundement that noe man for me or any other withstand or deny them the same, or disquiet that which I doe graunt in any wise vnto St Peter or Aacholyne Bishop or any his Successors. This is in the Inspecimus Charters of Confirmacons made to Richard Fox and Peter Courtney Bishops of Winchester, as they are inrolled in the Chauncery 30 Janu. 2 H. 8 and 13 Novemb. 4 H. 8.

Roger Cole of Hutenesleigh in the Countie of Devon liued 24 E. 1 Kirkbyes Inquest.

daughter of . . . *Argent a bull passant sable armed etc. or, a bordure of the second bezanté.*

Richard Cole of the County of Devon liued in the tyme of H. 3 as apperes by the Charter (to the Monastery of Bromer or Bruarne) of Amice Reduers Countesse of Devon the relict of Baldwin E. of Devon who 25 H. 3 was at the Suite of Rich. E. of Cornwall King of the Romanes created Earle of the Isle of Wight which E. Rich. bare a Bordure of Cornwall about his Coate, being in a shield Argent a lyon rampant gules crowned, And . . . he gaue the same Bordure to this or one of the Auncestors of this family of Cole, as an Augmentacon for service in the warres. Elizabeth daughter of Hugh Willoughby Montgomery of Carow in the County of Monaghan Esq. married Oct. 1728 Died April 1771. *Cole, impaling quarterly 1 and 4 azure three fleurs-de-lis or—Montgomery, 2 and 3 gules three annulets or, gemmed azure—Eglinton, all within a double tressure flory counter flory or, on an inesccheon argent a sword and sceptre in saltire gules.*

Through this marriage the Earl of Enniskillen is co-representative of a branch of the great and distinguished family of Montgomery ennobled under the titles of Viscount Montgomery and Earl of Mount Alexander and sprung originally from the House of Eglinton. Hon. George Montgomery of Downbreakie and Ballylessan, a military officer of eminence, youngest son of Hugh 1st Viscount Montgomery of Ards by Elizabeth Shaw his wife, daughter of the Laird of Greenock; married 1683 Grizel, eldest daughter of Sir John M^d Dowell of Garthland in Galloway, and dying 1674, was succeeded by his eldest son Hugh Montgomery esquire, of Ballylessan and of Carrow co. 
